'O Gloriosa Domina' is the second half of the hymn 'Quem terra, pontus, aethera,' which was composed by Venantius Fortunatus (530-609), the Bishop of Poitiers.

Both hymns are popular Marian hymns used in the Liturgy, 'Quem terra, pontus, aethera' being used for the Office of the Matins, and this hymn being used for Lauds in the Common of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

The hymn was a favorite of St. Anthony of Padua. Tradition has it that it was sung by St. Anthony's mother when he was an infant. It was such a favorite of St. Anthony, that it was constantly on his lips during his life and he sang it at his death.
