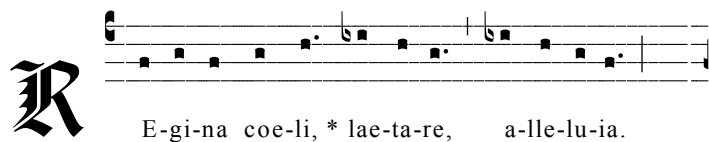

Prayer




