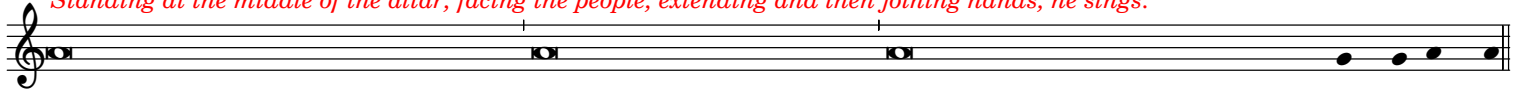


The Liturgy of the Eucharist

Orate, Fratres

Standing at the middle of the altar, facing the people, extending and then joining hands, he sings:

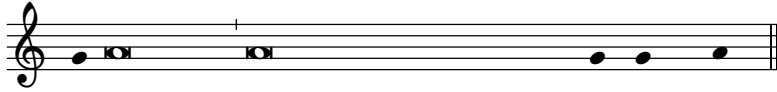


Pray, brethren (brothers and sisters), that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the al- might- y Fa- ther.

The people rise and reply:



May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name,



for our good and the good of all his ho- ly Church.

Preface Dialog



The Lord be with you. **And with your spir- it.** Lift up your hearts.



We lift them up to the Lord. Let us give thanks for the Lord our God. **It is right and just.**

Sanctus (Holy, Holy)



Ho- ly, Ho- ly, Ho- ly Lord God of hosts. Heav- en and earth are full of your glo- ry. Ho- san- na in the high- est.



Bless- ed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Ho- san- na in the high- est.

Memorial Acclamation

Then the priest sings:



The mys- ter- y of faith.

And the people continue, acclaiming:



We pro- claim your Death, O Lord, and pro- fess your Res- ur- rec- tion un- til you come a- gain.

Or:



When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we pro- claim your Death O Lord, un- til you come a- gain.

Or:



Save us, Sav- ior of the world, for by your Cross and Res- ur- rec- tion you have set us free.
