CONCLUDING RITE

Blessing of the Oil of Catechumens

The Bishop blesses the Oil of Catechumens, which is used in preparing those adults and children who are to receive the saving waters of baptism, to be strengthened by Christ to resist the power of Satan and reject evil in all its forms.

Consecration of the Sacred Chrism

The Bishop receives the oil to be used for the Sacred Chrism, pours in the mixture of balsam and sweet perfume, and breathes over the chrism as part of an ancient tradition. He then prays the prayer of consecration over the oil mixture. The Sacred Chrism is a gracious gift of the Holy Spirit, to consecrate adults and children who are baptized and confirmed, anoint the hands of priests when they are ordained, and sanctify the altar and church walls during a dedication rite.

Blessing of the Oil of the Sick

The blessing of the Oil of the Sick takes place within the Eucharistic prayer, in an ancient church tradition dating back to the Gelasian and the Gregorian Sacramentaries.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading: **Isaiah 61: 1-3, 6a, 8b-9** (*Proclaimed in Cantonese*)

The spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me; he has sent me to bring glad tidings to the poor, to heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives and release to the prisoners, to announce a year of favor from the LORD and a day of vindication by our God, to comfort all who mourn; to place on those who mourn in Zion a diadem instead of ashes, to give them oil of gladness in place of mourning, a glorious mantle instead of a listless spirit.

You yourselves shall be named priests of the LORD, ministers of our God you shall be called. I will give them their recompense faithfully, a lasting covenant I will make with them. Homily

Renewal of Commitment to Priestly Service:

Bishop Cordileone (addressing the priests):

My brother priests today we celebrate the memory of the first Eucharist, at which our Lord Jesus Christ shared with his apostles and with us his call to the priestly service of his Church.

Now, in the presence of your bishop and God's holy people, are you ready to renew your own dedication to Christ as priests of his new covenant?

Priests: **I am**

Bishop Cordileone: *At your ordination you accepted the responsibilities of the priesthood out of love for the Lord Jesus and his Church. Are you resolved to unite yourselves more closely to Christ and to try and become more like him by joyfully sacrificing your own pleasure and ambition to bring his peace and love to your brothers and sisters?*

Priests: **I am**

Bishop Cordileone: *Are you resolved to be faithful ministers of the mysteries of God, to celebrate the Eucharist and the other liturgical services with sincere devotion? Are you resolved to imitate Jesus Christ, the head and shepherd of the Church, by teaching the Christian faith without thinking of your own profit, solely for the well-being of the people you were sent to serve?*

Priests: **I am**

Bishop Cordileone (addressing the assembly): *My brothers and sisters, pray for your priests. Ask the Lord to bless them with the fullness of his love, to help them to be faithful ministers of Christ the High Priest, so that they will be able to lead you to him, the fountain of your salvation.*

Assembly: **Lord Jesus Christ, hear us and answer our prayer.**

Bishop Cordileone: *Pray also for me, that despite my own unworthiness I may faithfully fulfill the office of apostle which Jesus Christ has entrusted to me. Pray that I may become more like our High Priest and Good Shepherd, the teacher and servant of all, and so be a genuine sign of Christ's loving presence among you.*

Assembly: **Lord Jesus Christ, hear us and answer our prayer.**

Bishop Cordileone: *May the Lord in his love keep you close to him always, and may he bring all of us, his priests and people, to eternal life.*

All: **Amen**
