Give strength; bear aid.

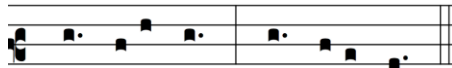

### **Sung Holy Rosary of Our Lady (40 min)**

In honor of today's feast we will pray the Holy Rosary with added solemnity. The prayers of the Rosary will be sung using psalm tones. The purpose of singing the Rosary to inspire a more fruitful contemplation of Jesus's life through Mary's eyes and to offer a beautiful gift to Our Lady on this feast in thanksgiving for her constant intercession before her Son for us.

The women's ensemble will lead the singing. You are welcome to sing on your side's turn, or just enter into the contemplation of our Lord's life silently. We will pray the Joyful mysteries of the Rosary.



The First Joyful Mystery:


The Angel Gabriel announces to Mary she will be the mother of God.

The Second Joyful Mystery:


Mary travels to the house of Zachariah to visit her cousin Elizabeth who is also with child. .

The Third Joyful Mystery:

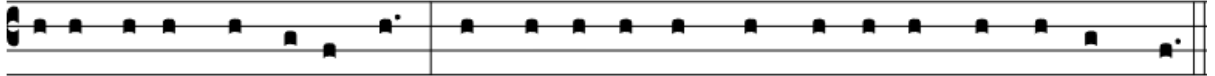
The Son of God is born in a stable, and the angels declared, "Glory to God in the Highest!"

The Fourth Joyful Mystery:

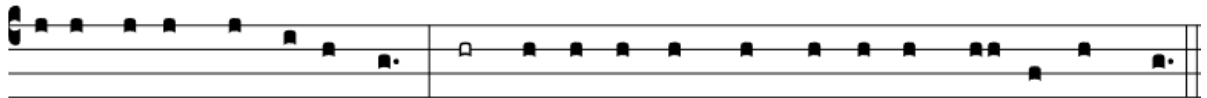
Mary and Joseph present Jesus in the Temple of Jerusalem.

“Holy, holy, holy Lord!”








