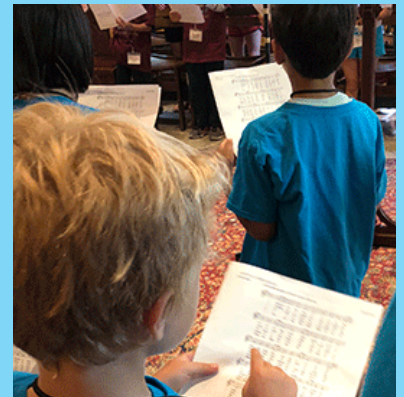
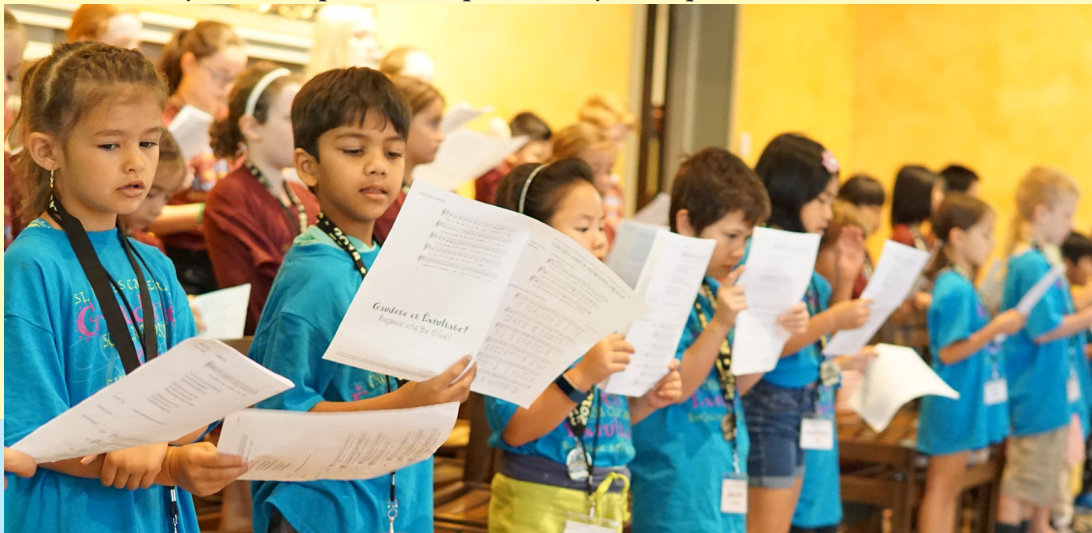
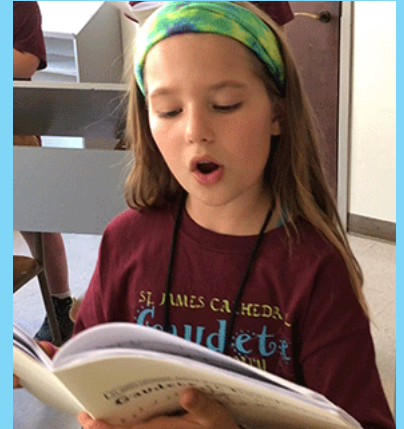
For five days, campers sing, laugh, and play in a beautiful and welcoming environment. Choristers will learn a variety of music spanning the Church's history, from ancient to modern. Campers share their music through a mid-week mini-concert at a nearby retirement community and a Friday Cathedral concert; and on Sunday, they provide the music for the 10:00am Mass. This year, we have simultaneous programs for singers entering grades 1–3 in the fall (Seraphim Choir) and those entering grades 4–8 (Schola Cantorum).

Each day begins with the sung Morning Praise service and continues with rehearsal, fun activities on the Cathedral grounds, and lessons on topics in the life of the Church.

Over the course of the week, senior choristers have an opportunity to take over and get a taste of being a leader of the liturgy.

Tuition is \$100 for the week; need-based scholarships are available upon request. Campers bring a bag lunch; two snacks are provided each day. Each camper receives a camp t-shirt!

Registration for children entering grades 4–8 in the fall requires a short interview with Youth Music Director Stacey Sunde to assess the ability to match pitch and reproduce rhythmic patterns.

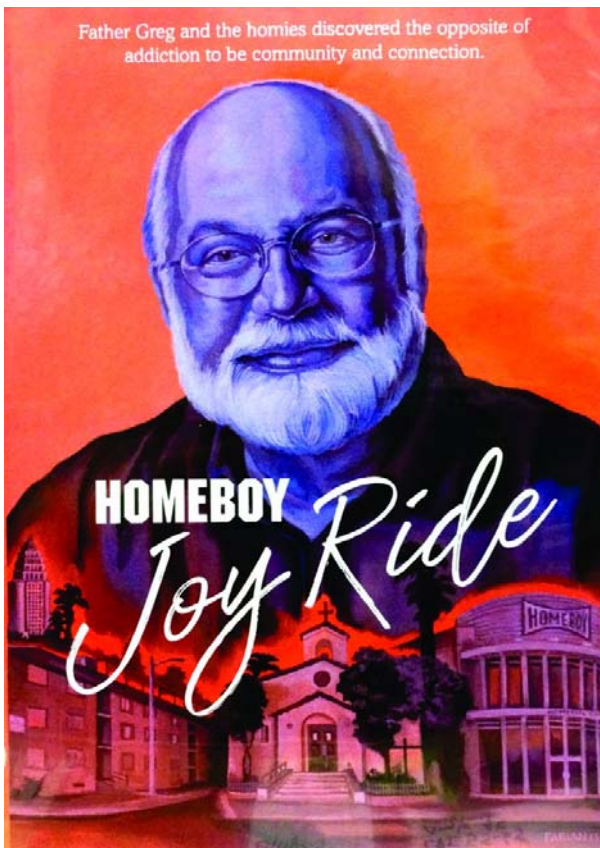

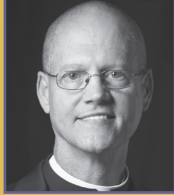
