Editor's Note

This volume contains very simple settings of the minor proper antiphons of the mass – Entrance, Gradual, Alleluia, Tract, Offertory, and Communion – according to the new order of mass promulgated by Pope Saint Paul VI. They follow the format of *The English Gradual, Part II* edited by Francis Burgess. While Burgess's work has been adapted twice for the Roman Catholics of the Anglican tradition – first as the *Anglican Use Gradual* and more recently as *The Saint Peter Gradual* – it has never been adapted to a more modern English in the style of the *Roman Missal* (2011). This volume attempts to fill that void, providing a book from which a choir of any ability – or even the entire congregation – can provide the proper of the mass on Sundays, Solemnities, and Feasts during the liturgical year.

In addition to the five minor propers mentioned above, other chants proper to certain feasts are also included, particularly when they would be useful in parish liturgies. Some of these chants are set to psalm tones; others, to their proper melodies as found in the *Roman Missal* (2011); and a few others to their proper melody as adapted by the editor.

The psalm tones in the book utilize the same modes as found in The English Gradual, but the melodies are those found in the Roman chant books. The mode V tone for the Graduals is an amalgamation of the Anglican and Roman melodic traditions.

The chants are transcribed in stemless noteheads on the modern five-line staff to be accessible to as many Catholics musicians as possible. The last note before any sort of barline should be lengthened; when other notes are to be lengthened, this is indicated by a tenuto mark above the note.

Translations of the Latin chants were taken from the *Roman Missal Third Edition* whenever possible. When texts in the *Roman Missal Third Edition* did not match the whole text as found in the *Graduale*, the translation was taken from another source. Frequently, the most faithful rendering of the Latin texts was found in the *Gregorian Missal*, so those translations were often used.

The following practical notes may be found of use in performing the chants:

- The *Entrance* is to accompany the procession of the ministers to the altar. At many cathedrals and parishes in the USA, it is the common practice to include both a congregational hymn and the Entrance chant as accompaniment for the procession.
- The *Gradual* is begun when the First Reading has ended. When the *Gradual* is sung, the Responsorial Psalm from the Lectionary is omitted. During Eastertide (but not on Easter Day) the *Gradual* is replaced by an *Alleluia*.
- The *Alleluia* or *Tract* is sung when the Second Reading has ended.
- The *Sequence*, when it occurs, is sung immediately without pause after the verse of the *Alleluia*. The final repetition of the word *Alleluia* occurs at the end of the *Sequence* to a brief musical phrase in the mode of the *Sequence*. This method of singing the *Sequence*, while different than the order found in the Lectionary, is the ancient method of singing the *Sequence* and is the order found in the *Graduale Romanum*.
- The *Offertory* is sung after the Universal Prayer (Prayer of the Faithful), while the altar is prepared.
- The *Communion* is begun while the celebrant is receiving the Sacrament.
