INTROIT

Deus in loco sancto suo

Ps 68 (67): 6, 7, 36

GOD is in his ho-ly dwelling place; * the God
who causes us to dwell to-gether, one at heart, in his
house; he himself will give power and strength to his
people.

Psalm 68 (67)

1. Let God arise; let his foes *be scattered*. *
Let those who hate him flee from *his presence*.
As smoke is driven away, so drive them away; †
like wax that melts before *the fire*, *
so the wicked shall perish at the presence *of God*.
