Hymn *Aeterne rerum conditor*. (11.11.11.5)

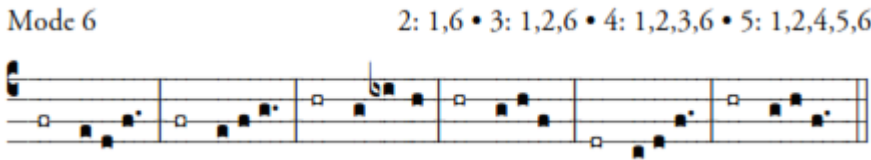
Lo! The dim shadows of the night are waning

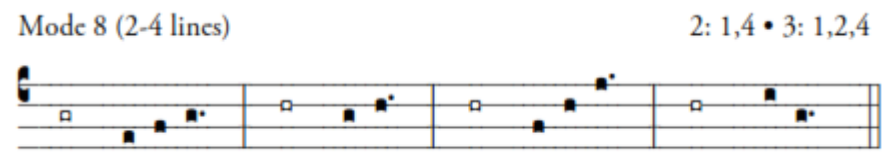
Ant. 2 ¹Let us sing a hymn of praise **to** our God, ⁴alleluia
