## **DIRECTOR OF MUSIC**

## **QUALIFICATIONS:**

- 1. Genuine appreciation of liturgy and its importance in the life of the church.
- 2. Knowledge and understanding of liturgy and the authoritative liturgical documents of the Church (e.g., *Sacrosanctum concilium*, *Musicam sacram*, etc.); or willingness to learn.
- 3. Knowledge of plainchant—especially plainchant resources in English.
- 4. General musical and liturgical knowledge including:
  - a. ability to play the organ competently
  - b. ability to cantor
  - c. ability to direct an SATB choir including good working knowledge of vocal technique, diction, repertoire, and performance practice
  - d. demonstrated knowledge of and appreciation for current and past appropriate liturgical music resources—especially plainchant and sacred choral music.
- 5. Possession of the following personal qualities:
  - a. ability to work and collaborate with the pastor
  - b. ability to work patiently with and teach people of all ages
  - c. flexibility, dependability, and punctuality
  - d. good organizational skills
  - e. love for prayer and liturgy

## RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Collaborates with, and is responsible to, the Pastor for the entire liturgical music program of the parish, and has direct supervisory responsibility over all involved in the music program.
- 2. Provides organ accompaniment at Mass on Sundays, Holy Days, and at other parish liturgical celebrations (e.g., Solemn Evening Prayer, Holy Week, Confirmation and First Communion, etc).
- 3. Provides accompaniment at funerals and weddings for a fee. Meets with the families

- and/or couples as appropriate.
- 4. Schedules other organists/instrumentalists for weekend Masses and Holy Days of obligation as needed.
- 5. Maintains and develops the parish Cantor program:
  - a. Cantors at liturgies as needed.
  - b. Trains, recruits, and schedules parish cantors for all parish liturgies.
  - c. Gives vocal guidance to cantors if needed.
- 6. Maintains and develops the parish choral program:
  - a. Recruits, organizes, and directs adult choirs for Sundays, Holy Days, and other major celebrations. Depending on the ensemble, this should include developing polyphonic repertoire and training in plainchant.
  - b. Educates parish musicians in relevant areas including:
    - i. Vocal technique, intonation, rhythm, performance practice, music history, music appreciation, and liturgical theology.
    - ii. Provides a central musical and liturgical resource for all music ministers.
- 7. Selects music for liturgies according to the following criteria:
  - a. musical quality
  - b. appropriateness of text
  - c. pastoral appropriateness
- 8. Prepares, as needed, appropriate worship aids for the assembly.
- 9. Maintains the parish's music library including sheet music for choirs, cantors, and instrumentalists.
- 10. Develops the musical life of the parish through offering seasonal concerts, organ recitals, and educational opportunities when possible.
- 11. Prepares and presents an annual music budget.
- 12. Attends to the maintenance of the parish's musical instruments, especially the pipe organ.
- 13. Maintains currency of musical and liturgical knowledge.
- 14. Occasionally assists the Director of Faith Formation with the sacred music component of the religious education program.
- 15. Accepts, as requested by the Pastor, miscellaneous tasks and responsibilities which are directly connected to the liturgical or musical life of the parish. [For example, possibly assisting the Pastor in the training of new and current liturgical ministers.]
