Lent Sunday IV It was unheard of for **anyone** ²to open the eyes of a man **born** blind ⁴until the coming of Christ, the Son **of** God.

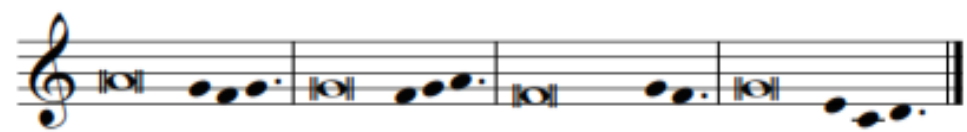
PSALMODY

Lord, hear our prayer.

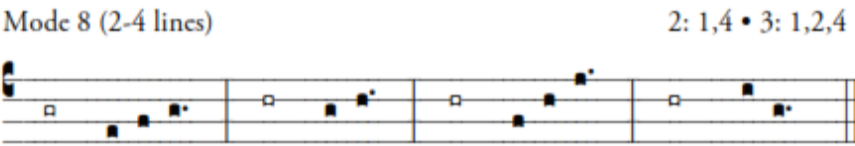
Father and Lord of all, you sent your Son into the world, that your name might be glorified in every place,

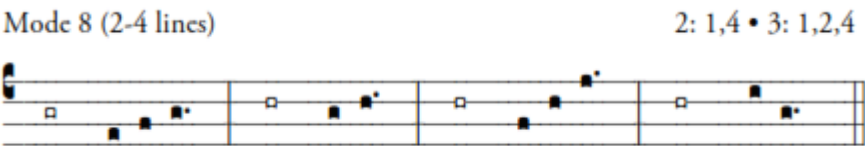
