THE PSALMS throughout the year may be sung to Tone VIII 1.

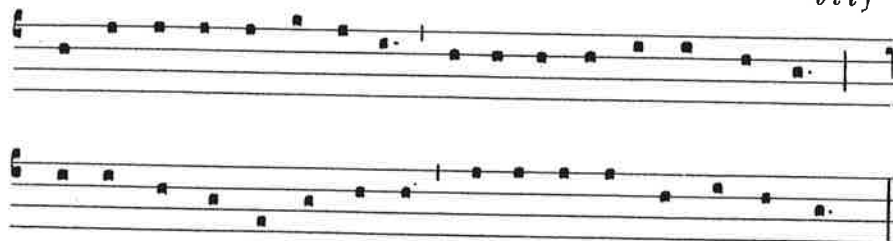
