Welcome to our celebration of the Traditional Latin Mass (Low Mass). Out of respect for our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, as well as your fellow worshipers. please turn off cell phones and pagers. To facilitate your prayerful participation, Latin-English Missalettes are provided for your use. The Readings and Prayers therein are specific for Trinity Sunday. Today's Readings will be found in this trifold, or in your personal Missal. You are invited to participate in the dialogue of the Mass by joining the altar servers in all the responses except for the Prayers at the Foot of the Altar. Your responses include the entire Pater noster as well as the triple Domine, non sum dignus just before the Communion to the laity.



Introit: *Gaudeámus omnes in Dómino*

+ Let us all rejoice in the Lord, celebrating a festival day in honor of all the Saints: At whose solemnity the Angels rejoice, and give praise to the Son of God. (Missale Romanum) Rejoice in the Lord, ye just: praise becometh the upright. (Ps. 32:1) Glory be to the Father . . . Let us all rejoice . . .

Low Mass begins with Kyrie on p. 9 in the Missalette, and then continues here:

Opening Collect:

Let us pray: Almighty and everlasting God, who hast granted us to honor in one solemn Feast the merits of all Thy Saints: we beseech Thee, that, since so many are praying for us, Thou wouldst pour forth upon us the abundance of Thy mercy, for which we long. Through the same Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son, who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, world without end. Amen.

Epistle: Rev. 14:22-25; 15:10

Lesson from the Book of Revelation.

n those days, behold, I, John, saw another Angel ascending from the rising of the sun, having the sign of the living God. And he cried with a loud voice to the four Angels, to whom it was given to hurt the earth and the sea, saving. Hurt not the earth nor the sea, nor the trees, till we sign the servants of our God in their foreheads. And I heard the number of them that were signed: a hundred and forty-four thousand were signed out of every tribe of the children of Israel. Of the tribe of Juda were twelve thousand signed: of the tribe of Ruben twelve thousand signed: of the tribe of Gad twelve thousand signed: of the tribe of Aser twelve thousand signed: of the tribe of Nephthali twelve thousand signed: of the tribe of Manasses twelve thousand signed: of the tribe of Simeon twelve thousand signed: of the tribe of Levi twelve thousand signed: of the tribe of Issachar twelve thousand signed: of the tribe of Zabulon twelve thousand signed: of the tribe of Joseph twelve thousand signed: of the tribe of Benjamin twelve thousand signed. After this, I saw a great multitude which no man could number, of all nations, and tribes, and peoples, and tongues, standing before the throne and in sight of the Lamb. And all the Angels stood round about the throne, and the ancients, and the four living creatures; and they fell down before the throne upon their faces, and adored God, saying, Amen. Benediction, and glory, and wisdom, and thanksgiving, honor, and power, strength to our God forever and ever. Amen.

Gradual: Timéte Dóminum omnes Sancti ejus Fear the Lord, all ye His Saints: for there is no want to them that fear Him. But they that seek the Lord shall not be deprived of any good. (Ps. 33:10-11)

Alleluia: Veníte ad me omnes

Alleluia, alleluia. Come to Me all you that labor and are heavy laden, and I will refresh you. (Matthew 11:28) Alleluia.

Gospel: Matthew 5:1-12



t that time: Jesus seeing the multitudes, went up into a mountain: and when He was sat down, His disciples came unto Him. And opening His mouth, He Laught them, saying: Blessed are the poor in spirit; for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are the meek; for they shall possess the land. Blessed are they that mourn; for they shall be comforted. Blessed are they that hunger and thirst after justice; for they shall have their fill. Blessed are the clean of heart; for they shall see God. Blessed are the peace-makers; for they shall be called the children of God. Blessed are they that suffer persecution for justice' sake; for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are ye when they shall revile you, and persecute you, and speak all that is evil against you, untruly, for My sake: be glad and rejoice, for your reward is great in heaven.

Let us pray: We offer to Thee, O Lord, the Gifts of our devotion: may they be wellpleasing to Thee in honor of all the just, and likewise through Thy mercy, avail us unto salvation. Through our Lord, Jesus Christ, Thy Son, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee, in the Unity of the Holy Ghost, ever One God, world without end. Amen.

Preface:

It is meet and just, right and for our salvation, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto Thee, O holy Lord, Father almighty, everlasting God, through Christ our Lord. Through whom the Angels praise Thy Majesty, the Dominations worship it, the Powers stand in awe. The heavens and the heavenly hosts together with the blessed Seraphim in triumphant chorus unite to celebrate it. Together with them, we entreat Thee, that Thou mayest bid our voices also to be admitted, while we say in lowly praise:

The Mass continues with the Sanctus on p. 27 in the Missalette.

At the time for Holy Communion, Catholics in the state of grace should approach in two lines by the center aisle and kneel before the Communion rail. As a part of the Tridentine Rite only the Priest may touch the Body and Blood of Our Lord, therefore Holy Communion is not to be received in the hand. It is best to keep your hands below the top of the railing. As people receive Holy Communion, they should rise and return to their pews by the side aisles. Those behind them should immediately fill in the spaces at the Communion rail. Anyone having difficulty with kneeling may stand at the rail to receive Holy Communion.

Offertory: Justórum ánimæ in manu Dei sunt The souls of the just are in the hand of God, and the torment of malice shall not touch them: In the sight of the unwise they seemed to die, but they are in peace. Alleluia. (Sap. 3:1-3)

Beginning with the Offertory, the priest prays in a subdued voice. You can participate by singing or by silently praying the Offertory Prayers, which begin on p. 17 of the Missalette. The Mass then continues with the Secret below:

Offertory Hymn: Jerusalem, My Happy Home

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Communion: Beáti mundo corde, quóniam ipsi Deum vidébunt Blessed are the clean of heart, for they shall see God: blessed are the peace-makers, for they shall be called the children of God; Blessed are they that suffer persecution for justice' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. (*Matthew 5:8-10*)

Postcommunion:

Let us pray: Grant, we beseech Thee, O Lord, that Thy faithful people may ever rejoice in honoring all Thy Saints, and may be defended by their unceasing prayers. Through our Lord, Jesus Christ, Thy Son, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee, in the Unity of the Holy Ghost, ever One God, world without end. **Amen.**

The Mass concludes with the Last Gospel on p. 49 in the Missalette.


