


Psalm 34 (33)



## TWENTIETH SUNDAY




Psalm 84 (83): [11ab], 2, 3ab, 3cd, 4, 5

- 6. Blessed are they who dwell *in your* house, \* forever sing*ing your* praise.








Psalm 34 (33): 2-3, 10-11, 12-13, 14-15
