Removes denial’s stain with tears.

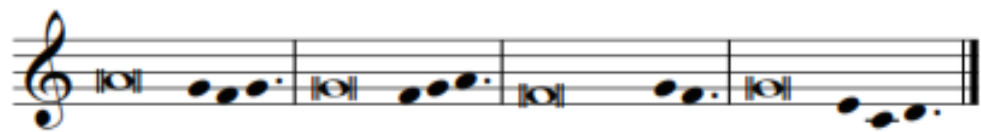
PSALMODY

dom of God’s children, alleluia.



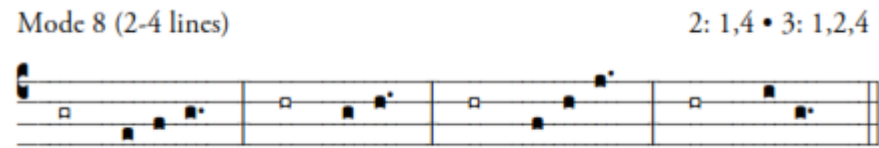
