

a dwelling for the Strong One of Jacob."

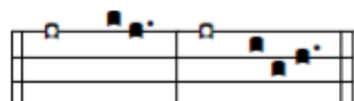

 it gives light to the eyes.




