


FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

—words: *Invocabit me*, cf *Psalm 91(90):15–16*;
music: plainsong ‘*Christe qui lux es et dies*’

SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT (Option 1)

The cantor sings, then all repeat:




To you my heart has spoken, Lord: I sought al-

us, Lord, Is-rael's God, free us from all fears.

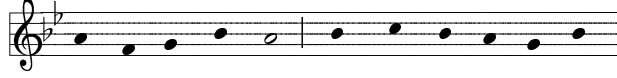
—words: *Reminiscere miserationum tuarum*, *Psalm 25(24):6*;

THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

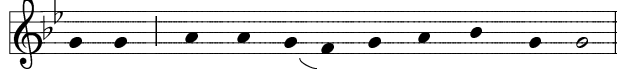
The cantor sings, then all repeat:

on me, for a - lone am I and in need.

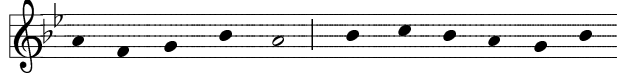
—words: *Oculi mei semper ad Dominum, Psalm 24:15–16*;

FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

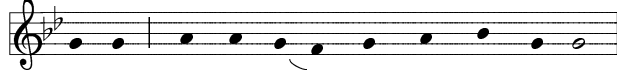
The cantor sings, then all repeat:
