Deacon Lord Jesus, you came to gather the nations into the peace of God's kingdom: Lord, have mercy.










FIRST READING (Proclaimed in Tagalog.)

Isaiah 61:1-3ab, 6a, 8b-9

The spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me; He has sent me to bring good news to the afflicted, to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, release to the prisoners, to announce a year of favor from the Lord and a day of vindication by our God; to comfort all who mourn; to place on those who mourn in Zion a diadem instead of ashes, to give them oil of gladness instead of mourning, a glorious mantle instead of a faint spirit.



RENEWAL OF COMMITMENT TO PRIESTLY SERVICE


Bishop Steib addresses the priests with questions that call on them to renew their commitment to priestly service.




- Sunlight makes the olive fruitful, From the fruit the oil is pressed; Savior of the generations, Now we bring it to be blessed.

 As we sing its fitting praise.




Parish representatives who have been asked to bring oils back to their parishes remain in their seats until the end of Mass when they will be invited to come forward to receive the oils for their parishes.

Chrism Mass A.D. 2014

The Chrism Mass is our annual celebration by our gathered local Church of the priesthood of Jesusthe-Anointed-by-the-Spirit. The baptized and the ordained really and truly participate in the one priesthood of Christ, although each in its own proper way. His priesthood is exercised in the sacraments, especially the sacraments most closely associated with the Eucharist: the sacraments of initiation and of orders, as well as the sacrament of the sick.

We the priestly people of God in the church of Memphis — hierarchically arranged with our bishop and our priests and our deacons — are not just blessing oils and consecrating chrism but we are praying for everyone and everything they will anoint in the coming year:

- Those who suffer illness in the coming year begin to be healed by our prayer for them at this Chrism Mass and by the oil of the sick which we bless.
- Those who are even now inquiring about our Catholic faith and who become catechumens in the coming year will be prepared for the sacraments of initiation by our prayer for them at this Chrism Mass and by the oil of catechumens which we bless.
- Infants in our diocese who are baptized in the coming year are lifted by our prayer, anointed by this same oil of catechumens as well as with Chrism consecrated by our prayer at this Mass.
- All those who will be confirmed in the coming year begin to complete their Christian initiation at this Chrism Mass by the chrism we consecrate here.
- Every new or renovated church and altar in our diocese dedicated in the coming year is already being claimed by us as sacred at this Chrism Mass with the chrism consecrated here.

The sacrament of marriage is also present in the Chrism Mass's allusions to the royal bridegroom Christ. Today we proclaim a portion of the marriage text of Isaiah 61:1—62:5 as our first reading. Today we proclaim the approach of Christ's marriage procession in Revelation 1 as the second reading, a wedding procession completed in Revelation 19:11ff and in Revelation 21:2ff with his bride's arrival.

So every time Bishop Steib invites us to pray at today's liturgy with the words, "Let us pray," let us enter into silent, intense prayer for ourselves, for our church, for our world, and especially for our sick, our catechumens, our infants, our confirmandi, and our new churches and altars. And let us recommit ourselves to be a Christ-ened people.
