



 flee, Help of the help-less, O a - bide with me.

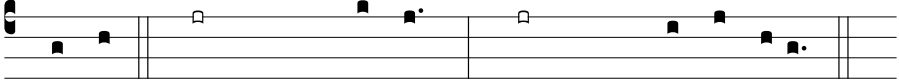
I fear no foe with thee at hand to bless;
