Duties: Oversees the entire parish's musical efforts; grows music ministry in accord with Pastor's vision and the key goals of glorifying God and fostering the sanctification of souls. The successful candidate will be a hard worker, patient teacher with good interpersonal skills to grow a program that currently has two adult choirs and very successful children's choir.
