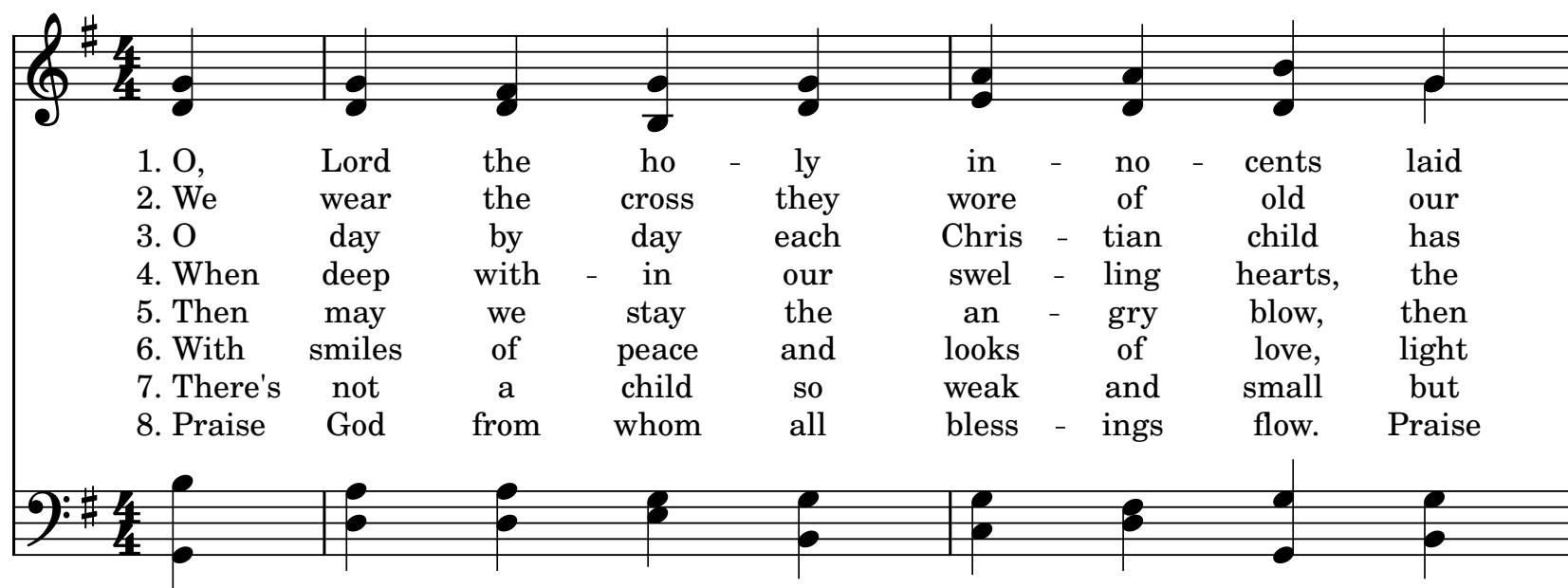

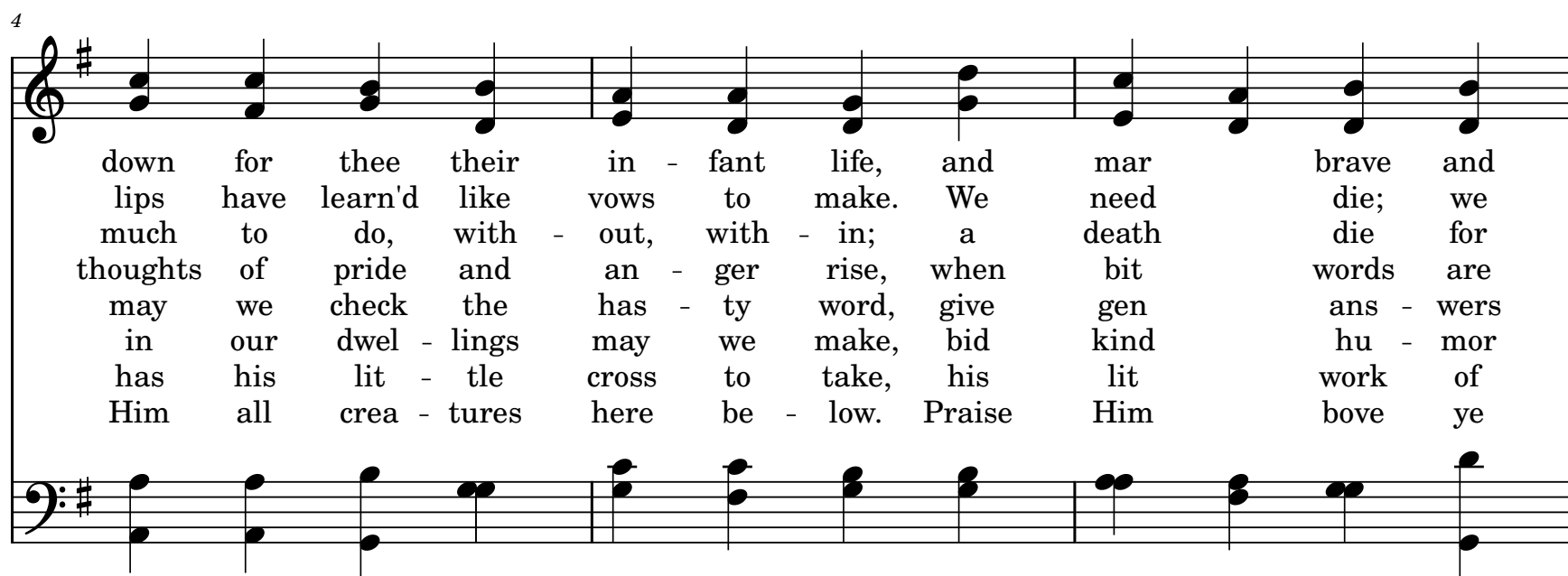

Tune: Thomas Tallis, circa 1567



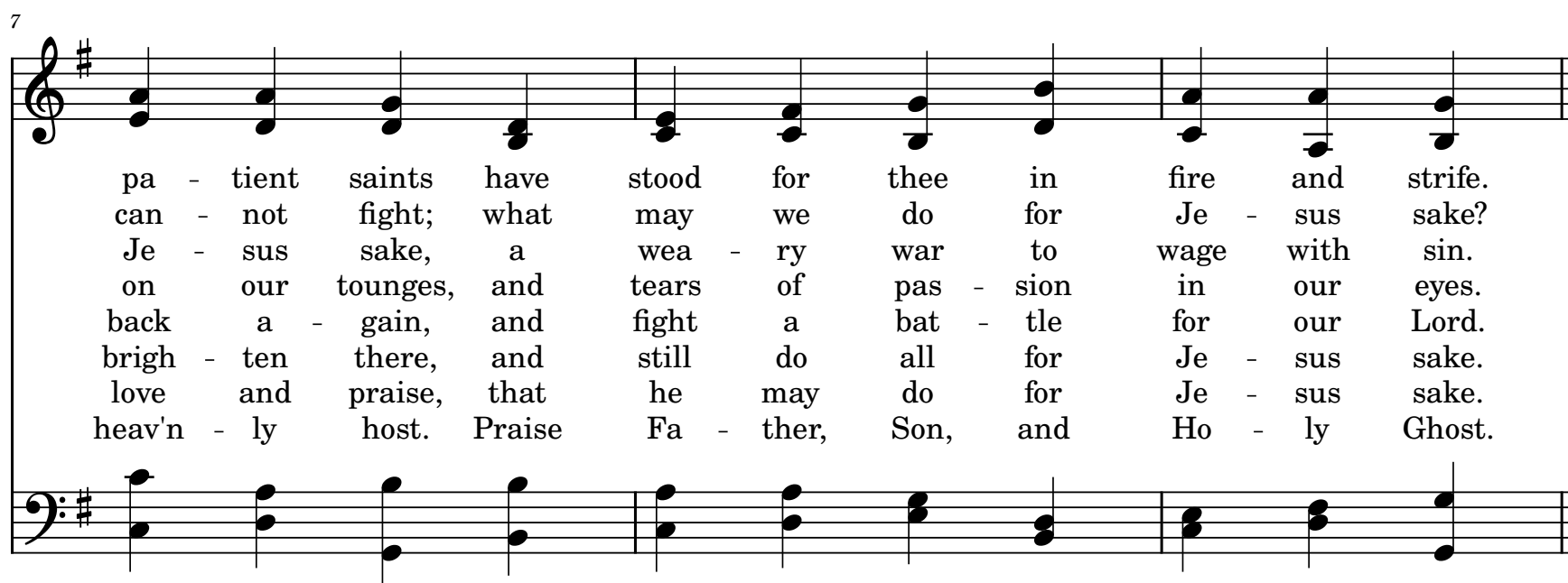
