

Annunciation Catholic Church Music for Mass on Sunday, 21st December 2014 Fourth Sunday of Advent

Please join in singing all parts indicated in **BOLD**. Music numbers refer to the back of the "Ignatius Pew Missal".

Prelude: Peter Christian Lutkin, Prelude on "Veni, veni, Emmanuel"

Introit: Let showers fall from the heavens, and let the clouds rain down the Just One. Let the earth open and bring forth the Savior. The heavens declare the glory of God: the firmament shows his handiwork. Glory ...

—Isaiah 45: 8; Psalm 18: 1

Kyrie: #18 (9am) or Mass XVII (11am) Please sing.

The congregation is asked to sing the entire Responsorial Psalm, <u>including the verses</u>:

Responsorial psalm (Psalm 89: 2-3, 4-5, 27-29):



R. (2a) For ever I will sing the goodness of the Lord.

The promises of the LORD I will sing for-ever; (Please sing the verses as well as the response.) through all generations my mouth shall proclaim your faithfulness. For you have said, "My kindness is estab-lished for-ever"; in heaven you have confirmed your faithfulness. R.

"I have made a covenant with my chosen one, I have sworn to David my servant:
Forever will I confirm your pos-terity and establish your throne for all ge-ne-rations." R.

"He shall say of me, 'You <u>are my father</u>, my God, the Rock, <u>my savior</u>.'
Forever I will maintain my <u>kind-ness toward</u> him, and my covenant with him stands firm." R.

Credo (11am): Sung "recto tono" (i.e., on a single pitch)

Offertory: Hail Mary, full of grace: the Lord is with you; blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb.

Motet (11am): Anerio "Ave maris stella"

Ave maris stella, Dei mater alma, atque semper virgo, felix cæli porta.

Sumens illud "Ave" Gabrielis ore funda nos is pace, mutans Evæ nomen.

Solve vincla reis, profer lumen cæcis mala nostra pelle, bona cuncta posce.

Monstra te esse matrem: sumat per te preces, qui pro nobis natus, tulit esse tuus.

Virgo sungularis, inter omnes mites, nos culpis solutos, mites fac et castos.

Vitam præsta puram, iter para tutum: ut videntes Jesum, semper collætemur.
