Prelude: Peter Christian Lutkin, Prelude on “Veni, veni, Emmanuel”

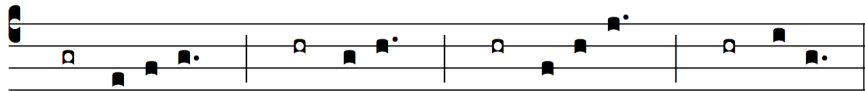
Introit: Let showers fall from the heavens, and let the clouds rain down the Just One. Let the earth open and bring forth the Savior. The heavens declare the glory of God: the firmament shows his handiwork. Glory ...

Responsorial psalm (Psalm 89: 2-3, 4-5, 27-29):



R. (2a) For ever I will sing the goodness of the Lord.

The promises of the LORD I will sing for-ever; (Please sing the verses as well as the response.)
through all generations my mouth shall proclaim your faithfulness.
For you have said, “My kindness is estab-lished for-ever”;
in heaven you have confirmed your faithfulness. R.

“I have made a covenant with my chosen one,
I have sworn to David my servant:
Forever will I confirm your pos-terity
and establish your throne for all ge-ne-rations.” R.

“He shall say of me, ‘You are my father,
my God, the Rock, my savior.’

Credo (11am): Sung “recto tono” (i.e., on a single pitch)

*Bestow a pure life, prepare a safe way:
That seeing Jesus, we may ever rejoice.*

Spiritu Sancto, tribus honor unus. Amen.

*Praise to God the Father, to the Most High Christ (be) glory,
To the Holy Spirit (be) honour, to the Three equally. Amen.*
